**Como os Eleitores de Inhambane foram Informados sobre as Eleições? Relatório da Observação/Pesquisa sobre o Acesso à Informação e Exercício da Cidadania nas Eleições Intercalares de Inhambane de 18 de Abril de 2012**

**Centro de Estudos e Promoção de Cidadania, Direitos Humanos e Meio Ambiente (CODD)**

Partindo do princípio que o acesso à informação é o condimento básico para a participação dos cidadãos na vida política, sobretudo em momentos eleitorais onde os cidadãos escolhem os seus governantes, o CODD procura aferir a maneira como os diversos intervenientes no processo eleitoral (os órgãos de gestão e administração eleitoral, cidadãos e partidos políticos) comunicaram em Inhambane.

Este relatório de pesquisa observa a comunicação no processo eleitoral em dois principais níveis. O primeiro está mais ligado aos órgãos eleitorais (sem excluir os partidos políticos) e procura perceber de

que maneira a informação sobre o processo eleitoral, bem como o apelo ao voto, terão contribuído para o nível de participação dos eleitores; e, o segundo está mais ligado aos partidos políticos e procura analisar as estratégias usadas por estes na comunicação com os seus eleitores.

O estudo apresenta quatro partes fundamentais: uma breve fundamentação teórica sobre o papel e os mecanismos de comunicação em processos eleitorais; as metodologias usadas para o processo de observação/pesquisa; a análise e discussão dos resultados e as lições aprendidas.

### **Banco de Moçambique: Histórias Vidas**

#### **Banco de Moçambique**

A presente obra, surge no contexto das comemorações dos trinta anos do Banco de Moçambique em 2005. O Conselho de Administração considerou imprescindível recuperar e imortalizar parte da história da instituição através da promoção de palestras dirigidas aos trabalhadores do Banco e convidados, proferidas pelos protagonistas da mesma.

Ao conjunto de testemunhos que foram apresentados designou-se sugestivamente "Histórias Vidas", como forma de dar conta do pendor eminentemente pessoal das diversas vivências, relatos que marcaram os trinta anos da existência do Banco.

Em 2010, no trigésimo quinto aniversário da criação do Banco, houve necessidade de

revisitar o percurso de crescimento da instituição, desde as negociações que levaram à assinatura dos Acordos de Lusaka, entre a Frelimo e o governo português em 1974, os quais estabeleceram o princípio da passagem dos activos e passivos do Departamento em Moçambique do Banco Nacional Ultramarino para o Banco Central a criar, até à relativamente recente reforma do sistema financeiro nacional.

A obra retrata cinco temas, nos quais se retraçam contornos do longo e sinuoso processo de construção não apenas do Banco Central do país, mas da própria Nação. Neles também se entrelaçam e complementam experiências individuais de personalidades que nesse processo deram o seu contributo. Também há na obra abordagens de enfoque marcadamente económico-financeiro e outras de cariz essencialmente político-legal.
