

Poverty in LAC has been falling...


Evolution of Poverty (4 US\$ per day) and GDP 1980 – 2008 in LAC

Income inequality in Latin American countries


(Gini coefficient, circa 2004-2005)


Fiscal Policy And Inequality


Inequality polarizes politics...




1 = "Incomes should be more equal"

Two Latin American Children: Probability of completing sixth grade on time




Two Paraguayan Children: Probability of having potable water in the house




Two Uruguayan Children:

Probability of a preventive dental visit (previous 6 months)




Two Chilean Children: Drobability of living in a haysabald with access to accept

Probability of living in a household with access to computers




Two Argentinean Children:

Probability of 2-5yo children receiving early education




European and Latin-American Children:


Probability of reaching an adequate level of mathematical knowledge (Level 2 of PISA)
