Carlos Nuno Castel-Branco:

"Aid Dependency and Development: a Question of Ownership? A Critical View"

Abstract: *Ownership* has become one of the key buzz words of international aid business. As a determinant of *commitment* to reform or *appropriateness* of the reform program, *ownership* (or lack of it) is referred to by recipient governments, donors and lenders, civil society organizations and scholars, alike, to explain success and failure of development aid and policy reform programs. This Working Paper discusses the concepts and applications of *ownership* in a critical manner, and suggests a political economy approach to understand *ownership* in the context of the contest and struggle for influence upon the direction, options and priorities of social, economic and political development. The paper also discusses the relationship between the evaluation of success and the struggle for ownership, as the definition and measure of success depends on the struggles about directions, options and priorities of development, which determine the questions that are asked and the focus of evaluation. Finally, the paper also questions the concept of *post-conflict state-building* because of its prescriptive, static and normative assumptions about the nature of conflict and of the state, and emphasizes the contested nature of conflict and state transformation within a political

economy approach. Hence, the framework to discuss *ownership, success and state transformation* is unified. The paper explores concrete situations of the Mozambican experience with aid dependency to illustrate its main arguments. (*Working paper nº 01/2008*)

"Por Uma Leitura Sócio-Histórica da Etnicidade em Moçambique"

Resumo: A história de Moçambique está marcada por, entre outros factores, reclamações de alguns moçambicanos que se dizem excluídos do poder político simplesmente por causa da sua pertença étnica. Partindo de uma perspectiva sócio-histórica, este artigo procura 1) perceber as razões que levam esses moçambicanos a sentirem-se excluídos, 2) compreender o que se encontra por detrás desse tipo de discurso. O principal argumento aqui é que a percepção deste fenômeno só é possível se analisarmos a maneira como Moçambique foi "fabricado" pelo colonialismo português. (*Discussion Paper nº 01/2008*.)

"Notas de Reflexão Sobre a Revolução Verde, Contributo para um Debate"

Resumo: Líderes Africanos apostam na Revolução Verde para a resolução do problema da fome e desenvolvimento em África por via do aumento da produção, produtividade e rendimentos agrícolas. Revolução Verde está sendo focada sobretudo em escolhas tecnológicas que são réplicas das experiências da Índia e América Latina dos anos 1960-1970, apesar das grandes diferenças económicas, políticas, sociais, culturais, científico-tecnológicas e ecológicas. Será que o problema da produção é só, ou fundamentalmente, de tecnologia? Será que a tecnologia é neutra relativamente aos padrões de produção, distribuição e integração da produção no processo de

acumulação capitalista? Como se explicam as grandes diferenças tecnológicas e de competitividade entre diferentes culturas, formas de organização social da produção e regiões em África? Quais são as condições logísticas para desenvolver a base produtiva rural de forma viável, sustentável e competitiva? Que lições podem ser extraídas da experiência histórica Africana e Moçambicana para uma reflexão, entre muitas possíveis, sobre a Revolução Verde em Moçambique? Estes, e outros, temas são discutidos como um contributo para um debate mais sistemático e metódico sobre a Revolução Verde em Moçambique. (*Discussion paper nº 02/2008*.)

"Mozambique Programme Aid Partners Performance Review 2007-Final Report"

Summary: This is the fourth independent evaluation of the Programme Aid Partners (PAPs) performance in Mozambique. These evaluations form part of the mutual accountability exercise in Mozambique, by which the performance of the Government of Mozambique (GoM) and the group of donors that provide general budget support, the PAPs, are evaluated against the performance indicators that the GoM and the PAPs jointly adopt. Thus, this report is the evaluation of the PAPs against their performance indicators for 2007. The mutual accountability exercise is one of the key factors in improving the effectiveness and efficiency of development aid. The report includes an extensive discussion of the methodology of evaluation and of the performance indicators, and evaluation of the performance of the PAPs group as a whole, an individual evaluation of the 18 agencies that formed the PAPs group in 2007, a rank of the PAPs according to individual performance, an comparative analysis of rank and scale of the PAPs, as well as various annexes containing the detailed data that were used for the analysis.
